SPRING STEM SCIENCE FAIR

We hosted the Highland Prep Academies STEM Science Fair where our students showcased their STEM projects alongside students from Highland Prep Surprise and Highland Prep West. Our Heat presented projects on subjects such as wind power, geothermal energy, robots, and gel electrophoresis. AUTOMATA PROJECT

2024 SEAPERCH SEASON

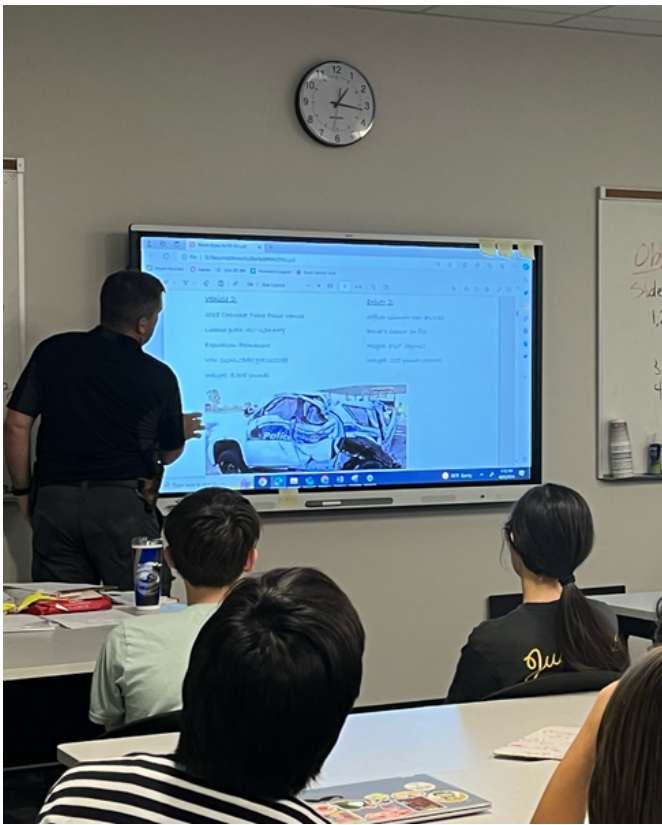

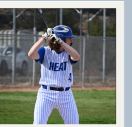

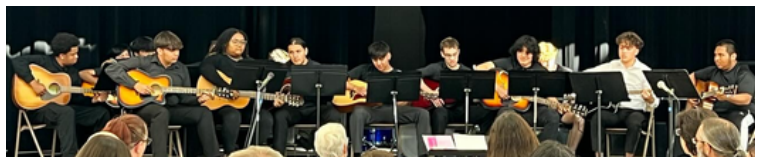


STARRY NIGHT PROM 2024
